Report of the Fifth Meeting of the Steering Committee of the Pacific Regional Centre (SCPRC-5) of the Pacific Regional Centre for Training and Technology Transfer for the Joint Implementation of the Basel and the Waigani Conventions in the South Pacific Region integrated within the Secretariat of the Pacific Regional Environmental Programme.

Introduction

- 1. The Fifth Meeting of the Steering Committee of the Pacific Regional Centre (SCPRC 5) for the joint implementation of the Basel and Waigani Conventions met in Nuku'alofa, Tonga on 21 February, 2017.
- 2. Present at the Meeting were sub-regional representatives from Australia, Polynesia represented by Samoa, Micronesia represented by Federated States of Micronesia, Melanesia by Vanuatu and New Zealand's position was filled by Niue. A full list of participants can be found in Annex 1.

Agenda item 1: Opening

3. The Steering Committee Meeting commenced at 1.45pm with a welcome from the outgoing Chairperson, Ms Laisani Lewanavanua representing Fiji.

Agenda item 2: Organisational Matters

- 4. The Secretariat drew the attention of the Meeting to the Rules of Procedure (Rule 22.3) which specifies that the five person steering committee should comprise three sub-regional representatives in addition to Australia and New Zealand.
- 5. The outgoing Chair invited nominations for, and election of, the Committee.
- 6. Samoa was nominated as the sub-regional representative for Polynesia. Vanuatu was nominated as the sub-regional representative for Melanesia, and Federated States of Micronesia was elected as the sub-regional representative of Micronesia.
- 7. In the absence of New Zealand, Niue was nominated as the fifth member of the committee.
- 8. The outgoing Chairperson, welcomed the Committee Members, before inviting Mr Haden Talagi, representing Niue, to commence official duties as Chairperson.
- 9. The Steering Committee:
 - elected Samoa as the sub-regional representative for Polynesia, Vanuatu as the sub-regional representative for Melanesia, and Federated States of Micronesia as the sub-regional representative of Micronesia; and
 - elected Niue as Chairperson, Australia as Vice Chairperson and Vanuatu as Rapporteur.

Agenda item 3: Adoption of the Agenda

- 10. The Chairperson invited the Steering Committee members to assume their roles, and invited members to endorse the provisional agenda.
- 11. The Steering Committee:
 - > adopted the Agenda which is attached as Annex 2.

Agenda Item 4: Matters relating to work programme of PRC SC-4

- 12. The Secretariat presented its report on the work undertaken in the implementation of the Convention to Ban the Importation into Forum Islands Countries of Hazardous and Radioactive Wastes and to Control the Trans-boundary Movement of Hazardous Wastes and the Management of Hazardous Wastes within the South Pacific Region (Waigani Convention) since COP-8.
- 13. The Steering Committee:
- > endorsed the report and recommended it for noting at the Waigani COP-9.

Agenda Item 5: Business Plan for the PRC 2018-2019

- 14. The Secretariat presented the 2018-2019 Business Plan for the PRC for consideration and endorsement.
- 15. The representative for Polynesia asked what support and assistance is available for countries not Party to the Basel Convention, and requested advice on the benefits of being Party to the convention and of assistance to non-Parties to attend meetings and access funding opportunities.
- 16. The Secretariat responded that assistance on the benefits of becoming a Party to the Basel Convention is always available. On the issue of funding to attend meetings, if a country is not Party to Basel convention there is no assistance available to attend meetings. The Secretariat further noted that this is one of the advantages of becoming a Party.
- 17. The Secretariat clarified that countries need to make formal requests with regard to capacity building.
- 18. The Secretariat explained that all requests for assistance made by countries at the STAC would be tabulated and sent to participants to confirm that all requests had been captured.
- 19. The representative of Melanesia requested that information about funding opportunities and timeframes is distributed to countries regularly. The Secretariat explained that this information has been sent out to countries previously and agreed to re-send any current information.

The Steering Committee:

> considered and endorsed the 2018-2019 Business Plan for the PRC.

Agenda Item 6: Cooperation with other institutions

- 20. The Secretariat reported to the Meeting on SPREP's working relationship with other relevant institutions.
- 21. In response to a question from Australia the Secretariat clarified that the Oceania Customs Organisation is an intergovernmental agency.
- 22. The Steering Committee:
 - > **noted** the report and recommended it for noting at the Waigani COP-9.

Agenda Item 7: Effectiveness of the SCPRC

- **23.** The Secretariat sought guidance from the Steering Committee on the new direction in which the SCPRC is to perform and manage the affairs of the Pacific Regional Centre.
- 24. The representative of Micronesia requested clarification on the timing of the meetings referred to in the document. The Secretariat clarified that one of the meetings would be a physical one but that the remainder would be virtual meetings, whereby the Chairperson would act as a conduit for information to Committee members.
- 25. In response to a question from Australia regarding intersessional work, the Secretariat clarified that the purpose of the Committee is to provide oversight on the running of the PRC, whereas the STAC is a subsidiary body of the Waigani Convention.
- 26. The Secretariat noted a request from the representative of Polynesia for budget assistance to cover communications costs.

27. The Steering Committee:

- acknowledged that the SCPRC needs help with effectiveness, direction and internal capacity;
- expressed its commitment to prioritising the implementation of the Basel and Waigani Conventions at the national level;
- agreed to trial quarterly reporting meetings between the SCPRC Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and the Secretariat with minutes to be forwarded to all SCPRC Members;
- agreed on the importance of SCPRC Members attending regional and international meetings of relevance, such as the OEWG;
- agreed on the importance of guidance being provided to SCPRC Members by the Secretariat; and
- directed the Secretariat to investigate capacity building opportunities at Tsinghua University.

Agenda Item 8: Other matters

- 28. The representative of Micronesia enquired as to the status of the co-financing of the Work Programme. The Secretariat advised that this was still under preparation.
- 29. No other matter was raised by the Steering Committee.

Agenda Item 9: Date and venue of the next meeting

- 30. The Steering Committee:
- ➤ agreed the next meeting would take place in Samoa at a date to be determined according to the scheduling of the Basel Convention COP;
- noted the request to dedicate one day to preparing countries for the BRS triple COP; and
- noted the request from sub-regional groups for one hour of preparation time before the start of future Steering Committee meetings

Agenda Item 10: Adoption of the Meeting Record

- 31. The Steering Committee:
- > adopted the draft report of the SCPRC-5 meeting; and
- recommended the report be forwarded to Waigani COP 9 for formal endorsement.
