SPREPs Green Climate Fund – proposed priority programmes for development

Following the Green Climate Fund Board decision at the June 2016 (GCF/B.13/18) to adopt initial guidelines for programmatic approaches¹, SPREP proposes to establish multi-county and interlinked programmes focused on delivery of outcomes within key thematic areas within SPREPs area of mandate. The programmatic approach provides a number of advantages including by:

- providing flexibility to work on country specific priorities and integrate these into the programme approach as they are identified and as countries are ready to engage;
- serving to establish a visible platform for engagement and coordination with partners, including to leverage additional financing;
- establishing more predictable financing, buy providing 'in-principle' approvals for long-term programme budgets;
- establishing the necessary resources (personnel) up front to manage the ongoing development of the programme,
- facilitate development of regional resources and knowledge sharing

Adopting the programmatic approach will not compromise the ability of SPREP to respond to the range of country climate priorities, though will support SPREP to progress a structured, well defined and strategic approach to delivery as an accredited entity to the AF and GCF. Details of the programmes to be further developed by SPREP is provided below.

SPREP also proposes to investigate opportunities associated with the GCF enhanced Direct Access (EDA) modality, which would establish a regional (or sub-regional) fund to finance priorities at sub-national and community level, in line with National policies and frameworks.

¹ A GCF programme could be defined as a set of interl inked individual sub - projects or phases, unified by an overarching vision, common objectives and contribution to strategic goals, which will deliver sustained climate results and impact in theGCF result areas efficiently, effectively and at scale.
