

territories. Photos must be taken in any Pacific island country or territory between 1 January 2006 and 30 August 2009.

Entry fees

There are no entry fees.

Entry rules and requirements

- 1. SPREP staff, staff of other Council of Regional Organisations in the Pacific (CROP) agencies and immediate family members are not eligible to enter.
- 2. All entries must be received no later than midnight GMT, 1 October 2009.
- 3. All entries must be submitted in digital format (either PSD or TIF) with resolution no less than 1024x768 at 300dpi, or as positive transparencies 35mm or larger.
- 4. Entries must be from nationals of SPREP member countries and territories.
- 5. Photos must be taken in SPREP member countries and territories.
- 6. Entries must not have been previously published in any form and may not have been selected in other photo competitions.
- 7. The person(s) submitting an entry must be the legal rights-holder for the image concerned and certifies this to SPREP at the time of entry.
- 8. Person(s) submitting an entry retain the copyright to the submitted materials, but grants explicit right to SPREP to publish and otherwise utilise for SPREP activities all entries electronically and in print without further compensation.
- 9. Submissions will not be returned.
- 10. No more than five entries per person will be accepted.
- 11. All entries should be accompanied by a caption or brief abstract describing the photo.
- 12. Photos will be judged by a panel selected by SPREP, with the judges' decision final.

Copyright

Photographers retain the copyright to all works submitted, but grant SPREP the right to use photos in connection with its not-for-profit climate change awareness activities.
