**SUBJECT: Announcing the Pacific Climate Change Centre – Knowledge Brokerage Support Program Open-Learning Course**

Dear Focal Points,

I am pleased to inform you of the addition of a new open-learning course on knowledge brokerage now available on the Pacific Climate Change Centre (PCCC) e-learning platform, URL: <https://spreptraining.moodlecloud.com/login/>. The PCCC Open-Learning courses aim to support anyone who is willing to contribute to achieving the goals and objectives of climate change policies, strategies and plans in Pacific Island Countries and Territories (PICTs).

This new course, the '**PCCC - Knowledge Broker Support Program (KBSP)**' focuses on the '*KBSP – Vol I Foundation Modules*' training manual that collates **tools, processes** and **case studies** to help knowledge brokers **mainstream climate change** and **future uncertainty** into their programs. By integrating climate change and future uncertainty, knowledge brokers can increase the *likelihood* of the long-term success of their programs.

The '*KBSP – Vol II Knowledge Broker Tools*' is a second training manual that is useful for NGOs, government and private sector individuals who are involved in decision-making at the community level. The eight (8) tools included in this manual are: i) **Community Adaptation Pathways**; ii) **Water Risk**; iii) **Participatory Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning (MEL)**; iv) **Theory of Change**; v) **The Wellbeing Tool – Assets Drivers Wellbeing Interaction Matrix (ADWIM)**; vi) **Value Chain Analysis**; vii) **Governance Mapping**; and viii) **Causal Loop Analysis**.

The course content and training manuals were co-developed in partnership between the Pacific Climate Change Centre, hosted at SPREP, the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO), the Australia Pacific Climate Partnership (APCP), with funding from the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT).
